CITY OF MADISON OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS

MINUTES OF THE MADISON CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 13, 2021

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Madison City Council was called to order by Mayor Greg Thole on Monday, September 13, at 5:07 p.m. in Council Chambers at City Hall. Councilmembers present were: Mayor Greg Thole, Adam Conroy, Tim Volk, Maynard Meyer and Paul Zahrbock. Also present were: City Manager Val Halvorson and City Clerk Christine Enderson.

AGENDA

Upon motion by Meyer, seconded by Zahrbock and carried, the Agenda was approved as amended. Additions include the age-friendly committee's land request. All agenda items are hereby placed on the table for discussion.

MINUTES

Upon motion by Conroy, seconded by Volk and carried, the August 23, 2021 regular meeting minutes were approved as presented.

PUBLIC PETITIONS, REQUESTS, HEARINGS AND COMMUNICATIONS

None

CONSENT AGENDA

Upon motion by Volk, seconded by Zahrbock and carried, the Consent Agenda was approved as presented.

CITY COUNCIL CHECKLIST

Council reviewed the checklist.

Councilmember Adam Conroy voiced a concern for a hole in the concrete in the alleyway behind the Western Guard from a recent fiber project. City Manager Val Halvorson stated she would discuss with the streets department and arrange for repair.

City Manager Halvorson reported she was in the process of completing the Request for Proposal for the CDBG-CV grant while DEED is working on the environmental forms.

SANITARY SEWER TELEVISING

Upon motion by Conroy, seconded by Volk and carried, Council approved the quote received from Underground Technologies of MN in the amount of \$9,269.00 to televise approximately 15,000 feet of sanitary sewer mains along TH 75, TH 40, and 241st Avenue to the wastewater treatment plant. Underground Technologies was one of five quotes received for the televising project.

SALVATION ARMY HEATSHARE

Upon motion by Zahrbock, seconded by Meyer and carried, Council approved participation in the Salvation Army's Heatshare Program by agreeing to purchase and include Heatshare brochures with the mailing of city utility bills at the end of September.

APPLICATION FOR EXEMPT PERMIT – CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Upon motion by Conroy, seconded by Volk and carried, Council approved execution of an Application of Exempt Permit without waiting period for the Madison Chamber of Commerce to conduct a raffle this fall.

PUBLIC HEARING – SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS UTILITIES & SERVICES

Upon motion by Volk, seconded by Zahrbock and carried, Council set a public hearing for special assessment of delinquent utilities, weed eradication, mowing, and other services at approximately 5:30 p.m. at City Hall on Monday, October 25th, 2020. Notices will be mailed to property owners and/or tenants.

CORONAVIRUS LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS

Upon motion by Meyer, seconded by Conroy and carried, **RESOLUTION 21-27** titled "Resolution to Accept the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Established Under the American Rescue Plan Act" was adopted. The City of Madison has receipted half of the ARPA allocation in the amount of \$74,071.92, with the second half coming in 2022. There is no urgency in spending, therefore options are being carefully vetted on the use of funds.

MRES - STRATEGIC PLANNING SESSIONS

Upon motion by Conroy, seconded by Meyer and carried, Council approved Strategic Planning Facilitation sessions to be coordinated by Missouri River Energy Services on November 1st and 8th from 4:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m.

AGE-FRIENDLY COMMITTEE REQUEST

Upon motion by Conroy, seconded by Volk and carried, Council approved the Age-Friendly Committee's request to place the musical instruments on the parcel to the north of the Grand Theatre pending permission of neighboring parcels.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Dog park: CEDA representative, Zack Bubany, held a meeting with a dog park committee for placement of the park, support, and ideas for funding. An area within Kiwanis Park was identified as the placement for the park.

MRES Bright Energy Solutions: The Power Team EnergyWise Program Summary Report was presented to Council from the 2020-2021 school year.

USAcquatics: Tom Schaffer with USAcquatics visited the swimming pool to address the breakage on the north wall. He will provide a report to the City on next steps.

Branding Committee: A meeting was held with Kelley Nemitz on August 31, 2021. They discussed logos the City has used over the years.

Preliminary Levy: City Manager Halvorson briefed Council on where the preliminary levy budget planning is at.

Demolition Estimates: No estimates at this time for the demolition of 311 7th Avenue.

MAYOR/COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilmember Meyer stated the public bathrooms still need equipment for ADA accessibility and stalls. City Manager Halvorson informed Council she is looking into the installation and whether there is viable room for stall partitions.

City Manager Halvorson reported that she brought up the LQPV State-Achievement sign at Chamber last week and they were very supportive.

Upon motion by Volk, seconded by Zahrbock and carried, Council approved disbursements for bills submitted between August 23, 2021 and September 13, 2021. These disbursements include United Prairie Check Nos. 61710-61802. Debit card purchases made between August 19 and September 2, 2021, were also approved as listed.
